Disability Collective and Equity, Diversity and Wellbeing Monthly Meeting Update and review Mate's Corner, including responsiveness and participation by students in the initiative. Many issues have been raised during these sessions regarding men's health and wellbeing as students and active members of the wider community. Discussions vary on a variety of topics.

I will undertake a future audit in consultation with the campus representatives concerning accessibility for all students. This will be reviewed in the June meeting after consultation with the various reps on how students are impacted by areas that may be deemed inaccessible to not only those with disabilities but also the wider student community.

International Day of Disability will be discussed in upcoming meetings to ensure the functionality of events run and the impact of the coinciding deferred exam period.

05/04/22 Disability Collective representatives' discussion with Haze Elford regarding Primary Creative Arts Project. Both Stephanie and Shobha facilitated it.

April/22 Mate's Corner Discussion Group.

April had been a highly active month for all participants. With the sessions coinciding with both Easter and assessment periods, two sessions were held. As with previous sessions, issues that affect the health and wellbeing of males were discussed, and various input from those attending provided several insights on how these issues are dealt with from differing perspectives.

Other discussion points included access to assistive technology for students who require this service to further enhance their learning experience at WSU, including advice for referrals made directly to Assistive Technology or via Disability Services. This meeting highlighted various issues, including timeframe and dissemination of meeting minutes, delays and difficulties in obtaining aid for students with disabilities, delays in obtaining appointments with counselling services, accessibility to facilities for students on campus, and the current format for Access News. Accessibility to be reviewed with input from campus reps in the upcoming weeks. Depending on the time available due to placement this month, I hope to organise a meeting with all campus reps on the views regarding accessibility and highlight deficiencies at each campus. Based on these assessments compiling a report on where problems are and future steps on implementing solutions to counteract these problems.

Ongoing/Future

- Possibility of a name change for the Disability Collective. This will allow students to send emails to the correct departments. The Disability Collective has received emails from students that should have been directly sent to Disability Services for some time. As shown in a previous meeting with Terri Mears, when a student begins to type Disability for the email respondent, they are often received by the Disability Collective and need to be triaged to the correct department within WSU.
- Bimonthly Disability Collective Meeting to be held in May, facilitated by Shobha and Stephanie. Unfortunately, during May, I will be on Practical Placement for my degree; however, I will collaborate with Stephanie and Shobha regarding the outcomes of this meeting and subsequent discussions.
- With the executive team of the Disability Collective in place, EOIs will be sent out within the next two weeks for additional collective representatives to fill the remaining places for general reps.
- Collaboration with the Cross Campus Equity Network to create the SRC's Inclusion Plan going forward in alignment with goals outlined in the Strategy meetings with Michael Connelly last 2021
- Collaboration with the Queer Collective regarding a possible movie night for World Hepatitis Day and World Aids Day. These days are held in late July and early December, and I will be reaching out to Rannie for collaboration in creating the event and a possible theme for the events. I have already reached out to Queer Collective Officers, and they are well aware of this event and very keen to assist.
- The second half of 2022 involves several days relating to chronic illnesses and mental health. For these initiatives, I will be collaborating with various collectives and members of the SRC for their insight to create events that are dedicated to these specific days

In late 2021, Western joined the United Nations-led 'Race to Zero for Universities and Colleges' Pledge, with ambitious new targets of achieving:

- Carbon Neutral by 2023, and
- Climate Positive by 2029

As part of that, the Environmental Sustainability Office of Estate and Commercial held a "Race to Zero" and Carbon Neutrality, two-part workshop to develop Western's Emissions Reduction Action Plan. In Session 1 - Western's carbon footprint, the company '100% Renewables', covered active accreditation and what it means, as well as Western's estimated carbon footprint. In Session 2 - Collaborative action planning, we broke into smaller groups for discussion and collaborative action planning to reduce Western's emissions. The two main things we explored were what changes in our role at Western and considered what broader changes could be made for Western?

LEAD Conference:


