These sessions continue to introduce new concepts that have become relevant among male identifying students who have attended the sessions. There have been some issues raised recently that will require further investigation with the university in view of certain equalities. Although the turnout for Mate's Corner is small, it has helped male identifying students that have attended and allowed them to have a space where they are free to express ideas and problems that have affected them, but also allowed them to have a space where they can be free to express themselves. In the last two sessions we have held discussions concerning International Men's Day in November and proposing ideas for an event to promote both this day and Movember. Although the day indicates Men's Day we will not be focusing on purely male centric ideology but will encompass those around us, especially our partners and friend who do not solely identify as male who have helped us progress to the men we are today.

21st June Meeting with Campbelltown Rep, Dharshini



During this session many ideas were discussed about possible future events that will take place at the Campbelltown Campus. One that is of significance is R U OK Day which will run on the 8th of September. I have taken the lead for this project as it falls into the Disabilities Portfolio and will be

seeking consultation with the Welfare and Wellbeing rep and the Campbelltown Campus Rep for to create an organising committee in conjunction with the Disability Collective.

21st June Disability Collective, Disability Services, Equity and Wellbeing Monthly Meeting

Discussions raised on the matter of accessibility of WSU shuttle bus services. This included aps being more accurate with tracking in real time. There have been issues raised by students about tracking being delayed and not actually indicating when shuttle buses will arrive or if they have been cancelled. There was a recommendation about the site of some of the shuttle bus stops, especially at Campbelltown opposite Security in Building 21. It is not properly accessible for those with mobility issues or parents who may require assistance with young children if boarding the shuttle. Accessibility for this stop will be investigated by Disability Services. Update to the above, the Disability Services has indicated that all stops are more accessible and do not pose an accessibility issue that was shown by the stop adjacent to building 21 at Campbelltown Campus. However, have advised Disability Services that the possibility of including one or more stops on the route at the Campus will allow for those who are not fully ambulatory to better access this service. During this period also collaborated with Dash (Campbelltown Rep) on proposed ideas for shuttle bus app upgrade including making the app more accessible for those with sight/vision impairments. Clarification on what the proposal entailed and then discussed with those attending the monthly meeting. It was accepted as a fantastic idea especially from the Disability Services point of view. More updates to be provided after further discussion with external stakeholders.

21st June Assisted in the gathering of and preparation for Breast Cancer Awareness High Tea

22nd June Assisted in the running of Breast Cancer Awareness High Tea at Campbelltown Catholic Club. Kudos to Vicky-Rae Reed for her efforts in organising and raising the awareness of this issue among students. Further applause to Romonda for her efforts in assisting on the day of the event.



June 30th CCEN meeting, discussing room improvements for collectives and SRC at Hawkesbury Campus. It was also at this meeting that I initiated contact with Harrison (Hudson) Try to collaborate on proposed movie nights for International Aids Day to remove stigma and raise awareness

Will be emailing Harrison (Hudson) with proposed ideas in the next week to gain a differing perspective and a greater holistic view from other student groups.

Further to this, I have collaborated with multiple student collectives and societies to schedule events for the remainder of the term, acknowledging various days of observance in ethnically diverse communities.

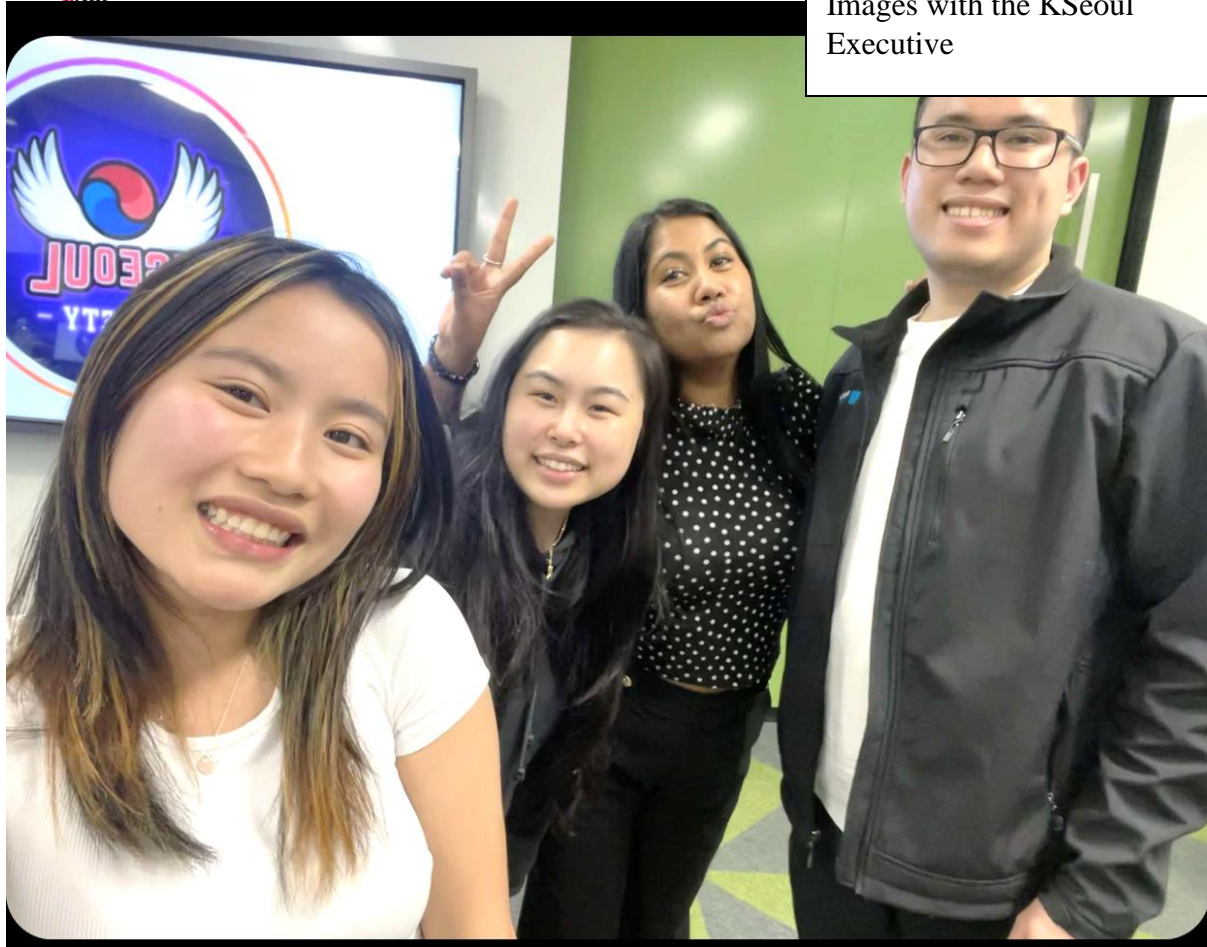
